Open-concept layouts, fabulous finishes, smart appliances, and the ability to customize the space to suit individual needs, all ensure that no-one complains about being stuck in the kitchen anymore!

Ottawa At Home takes a look at two impressive, large-scale kitchen renovations that are designed to please gourmet tastes while oozing with family personality.

CONTEMPORARY CHIC

Make no mistake, this very modern and award-winning kitchen reno is not just for show. With two young kids and a teenager in the Yelle household, Sylvain and Wendy quickly point out that it caters to a real family. Just don't expect to see any cute fridge magnets or kiddy clutter in their sleek new kitchen.

WESTBORO KITCHEN AFTER

After living in their Navan home for nearly a decade, the couple considered moving, but loved the neighbourhood. Any other homes they considered buying in the area also needed work, so they decided on a major overhaul of their living space. Under the direction of Friedemann Weinhardt of Design First Interiors, a new floor plan was drawn up for the late '80s style kitchen, and walls came down for a complete renovation that opened up the kitchen to the remodeled family room and dining area.

The open-concept floor plan has the effect of making the kitchen look much more spacious without building an addition or claiming space from adjoining rooms. It also allows unobstructed views to the family room and ongoing conversations with guests in the dining room.

Yet, less wall space translates into fewer cabinets and the minimalist design did not support overhead cabinetry. The answer
